



BUCKETS OF IDEAS

Bars and Restaurants: Used to serve peanuts in the shell; hold utensils, matches, napkins, straws, etc. Set empty buckets on the table to discard chicken bones, rib bones or shells. Can also be used as a “tip bucket” or be filled with ice to keep beverages cold.

Banks: The buckets can be filled with gold candy coins for a “pot of gold” look. Fill with a checkered table cloth, bottle of BBQ sauce and a BBQ brush and you have a summer give-away for opening a new account. Other themes might include golf or home construction, and the list continues.

Construction Companies: Give to customers to promote service or simply place around a job site for trash or add sand for cigarette disposal. Discarding unwanted materials and advertise at the same time.

Casinos: The tin bucket is a great casino bucket; it makes a fun give-away for “gold club” members filled with tokens, coins, or gift items.

Company Picnic: Any size bucket will work for this application. You can roll up a t-shirt or cap and put in a few odds and ends in the bucket for a company gift give-away. Tubs are also great for serving cold beverages at your picnic.

Beverage Companies: Probably the most common use for our buckets is to keep beer and other beverages cold. Used by beverage companies to promote brand awareness, special events or the introduction of a new beverage.

Hardware stores: Buckets to keep bolts, nuts, and other parts stored and separated. They also make a great point of purchase, filled with product at the front counter.

Convenient Stores: Cold beverages on ice at the counter or for product point of purchase displays.

Catering Services: A tank or tub filled with cold beverages and your logo is sure to get noticed.

Festivals: Tin cups or small buckets can be used as a collectable or souvenir for fair and festival goers.

Holiday décor buckets: All season baskets and decorative buckets for gift pack or display.

Floral or Garden shops: Galvanized buckets or tubs make a drip free way to carry potted plants or floral arrangements.

Weddings/Conventions: A small bucket can hold a bottle of water, small snack and directions to a wedding or other function. It can be placed in hotel room or given out as guests check in.

Trade Show/ self promotions: Fill with samples, brochures and other giveaways.

Real estate office: Let the first thing your new owner finds on move-in day be a bucket with your logo filled with coupons, samples, and advertisements from area businesses; plant or gift basket.

Bait shops: Fishing lures, bobbers, string, etc.
